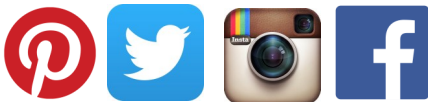


The 2017 Reading Challenge

How to play:

Lists are available at: Corona Public Library, the Senior Center, Circle City Center, the City Hall, our website and the Pinterest site.

We hope you'll join the Corona Public Library 2017 Reading Challenge and have fun, enlighten yourself in the process and share your recommendations with other readers.

The guidelines are simple:

- 1) Each month choose a category from which to pick your book. Choices of what to read are up to you as long as you meet the criteria of the category.
- 2) E-media, audio, and print titles are all eligible for the challenge. Titles may be from any place, but we hope you'll see what's available at the Corona Public Library and check it out!
- 4) Each time you finish reading a book, snap a photo of the cover title next to the 2017 Reading Challenge category line.
- 5) Post the photo along with the 2017 Reading Challenge category list using the hashtag **#readcpl2017** to Corona Public Library's Facebook page.
- 6) Earn an extra drawing ticket if you also post your book review and recommend the book to other readers!
- 7) Prize drawings will take place on the first business day of the month starting February 1, 2017 and will end with our grand prize drawing on January 2, 2018.
- 8) Winners will be announced via the library's Facebook site. Prizes will be held for one month at the library for pick up. Please ask at the Adult Info Desk.

Choose a different category for each month that you enter:

- A book published this year (2017)
- A book you can finish in a day
- A book you've been meaning to read
- A book recommended to you by your local Librarian or bookseller
- A book you should have read in school
- A book chosen for you by your spouse, partner, sibling, child, or BFF
- A book published before you were born
- A book that was banned at some point
- A book you previously abandoned
- A book you own but have never read
- A book that intimidates you
- A book you've already read at least once
- A book set in your home town or state
- A book translated from another language
- A memoir, biography or autobiography
- A book published the year you were born
- A book with a one-word title
- A book set in the future
- A self-improvement book
- A book written by a celebrity
- A collection of essays or short stories
- A graphic novel
- A famous author's lesser known book
- A National Book Award winner (any year)
- A book based on a true story
